- Decide how you would like your story shared.
- What will my story teach those who are listening?
- Have I had a negative experience that is still bothering me and will be too difficult to share in a constructive manner?

- Describe your health care experience.
- What helped or gave you strength during this time?
- Who made a difference in your journey?
- Tell us about your life today.
