


AED Registration Form Guide

Getting Started

- Note: The AED Registration Form must be downloaded to enable the submit button.
- Required Fields: Required fields are highlighted with red. Additionally, you can hover your cursor over a field to see if the field is required.
- Submit Form Button: After the AED Registration Form has been downloaded and all required fields have been filled click the submit form button to email your form to the Public Access Defibrillation (PAD) Coordinator.
- Clear Form Button: Click this button if you would like to delete all information on the registration form. Your information will not be saved.

Location Information



- Street Address: Enter your municipal address, or legal land location. Don't use P.O. of box numbers.
- Contact Name: Enter the name of the person who will be the point of contact for the public access defibrillation (PAD) coordinator.
- Internal Activation Number: This number will be contacted with a recorded voice message that a sudden cardiac arrest is occurring. This process will not function properly if the number given is part of an automated system.

AED Information

- AED Information Charts: Find the informational chart for the manufacturer of your AED, from the chart document the type or model, the battery type, and electrode pad type.
- Installed Check Box: Fill in the check box for the battery and electrode pad that are currently installed in your AED. This is a required field for one battery and one electrode.

AED Availability

By making your AED "public", you will be enhancing your community's ability to respond to a victim of sudden cardiac arrest. Time is the most critical variable in cardiac arrest survival. You, or your company, have recognized that by purchasing an AED.

Since our community subscribes to the AED Link system if a cardiac arrest occurs within 1,200 feet, approximately 6 hockey rinks or 4 football fields, of our location, the 9-1-1 call taker will be able to identify your location and direct someone to ask you, or a designee, to bring the AED to help save a life.

- Public Check Box: Fill in this check box if you would like your AED to be made available to your location
 as well nearby offsite locations.
- **Private Check Box:** Fill in this check box if you would like your AED to be used at your site only. A 9-1-1 call taker will only direct someone to use your AED at your location.
- Private with Responders Check Box: Fill in this check box if you would like your AED marked as private but any responders you have authorized to use your AED will be notified if a sudden cardiac arrest occurs near your location.

AED Availability

Daily Availability

Document which days of the week and what times during those days the AED is available. This can be customized down to each day of the week.

Seasonal Availability

Most AEDs are available year-round, but some AEDs, such as ones located at community pools or curling rinks, are only available during the part of the year the location is open. Document which times of the year your AED is available.

Placement Details

Document the place where the AED is located within your location. Try to picture a 9-1-1 call taker telling someone where to find the AED as quickly as possible. Enter as much detail as you can. For example - Inside the front door on the east wall next to the elevator.

- Daily Availability
- Seasonal Availability

AED Inspector



The most important part of having an AED is to make sure that it is ready to use when a cardiac emergency happens. This means making sure the battery is working and the electrode pads have not gone past their expiration date. Electrode pads will dry out after their expiration dates, and must be replaced periodically based on the manufacture's recommendations.

The inspector is responsible for the inspection and maintenance of your AED. The PAD Coordinator will invite the individual to be the inspector for their AED. The new inspector will receive an email from the National AED Registry asking if they wish to be the inspector for the AED listed in the email and to create an account. Following creating the account the new inspector will be able to view their assigned AEDs and update the expiration dates for batteries and electrode pads as well as the last inspection date. The inspector will receive monthly reminder emails to inspect their AEDs and a notification when either the battery or electrode pads are approaching its expiration date.

Responders



Responders are individuals who have agreed to respond to a call from the local 9-1-1 system to assist a victim of a nearby sudden cardiac arrest with their assigned AED. This notification will only be made if the victim is within 1,200 feet of the location of the AED. The notification is not based on where you are at the moment. If you are unable to respond, you will have the opportunity to press a button on your phone to communicate that information back to the AED Link system. If you receive text notifications you can reply "OK" if you will retrieve an AED and respond of "NA" if you are unable to respond. Each responder can receive either a voice message or a text message to notify them of a sudden cardiac arrest either at or near their location. There is no limit to the number of responders you can have listed for your AED. If you have more than 4 responders please use an AED Registry - Additional Responder Form. It is important to note by agreeing to be a responder there is no duty to respond and your good faith actions are covered by the Emergency Medical Aid Act in Saskatchewan.

Required Fields: Responders are not required, if responders are wanted the following fields must be filled out.

- Name
- Phone Number
- Email Address
- Voice and Text Message, Voice Message only, Text message only one must be checked.

Notes

Document anything further information you feel the PAD Coordinator should know about your location or AED. An example is driving directions for a location that a legal land location was given for.
