Licensed Practical Nurse

Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) opportunities are available in rural and urban communities. The highest demand is currently in long term care and rural hospitals and health centres. LPNs in Saskatchewan are amongst the highest paid in Canada.

In order to practice as a Licensed Practical Nurse in Saskatchewan, individuals must

- Have completed a 2 year Practical Nursing diploma
- Be licensed with the Saskatchewan Association of Licensed Practical Nurses

Continuing Care Assistant

Continuing Care Assistants are in high demand in Saskatchewan. Opportunities are available in rural and urban communities, with the highest demand being in long term care and rural health centers. The province offers highly competitive salaries and incentives. In order to practice as a Continuing Care Assistant in Saskatchewan, the basic qualifications include;

- Have completed an approved 1 year Continuing Care Assistant certificate or equivalent.

For individuals who have studied outside of Saskatchewan, credential titles may include:

Home Health Aide, Personal Support Worker, Continuing Care Assistant, and Health Care Aide. As a guideline, programs should have over 500 hours in length, and provided proof of clinical experiences of over 150 hours.
