
Access to care was a concern for many respondents

"Retaining doctors in the area would be nice."

"Connecting to make appointments, it is not always easy to get through to offices to schedule appointments, especially when providers do their own bookings. Not all clinics have proper phone trees/staff to accommodate multiple calls. More doctors needed. Hard to find a doctor taking new patients."

14% of people who indicated that they have difficulty managing their health suggested that difficulty getting an appointment was a contributing factor.

Responses included = 17 Responses collected August to November 2023

- Collaboration with the Ministry of Health to ensure physicians are attracted to the area.
- Expanding existing programs to include enhanced addictions medicine support.

"Having a community resource i.e. a place to go or place to call that can help with education on what is available in the community. For example, specialists, psychologists. A place where all possible connections are listed/explained."

When asked about access to the following services, patients responded:

What are we doing to help?

 Nurse practioner appointment scheduling is reviewed regularly to ensure good use of the resource.
